## SECURE Project

- Comprehensive framework of all issues related to energy security including geopolitics, economic/regulatory and technical design of energy markets both inside and outside the EU
- Analysis of all major energy sources and technologies (oil, natural gas, coal, nuclear, renewable and electricity) from upstream to downstream (supply and demand side approach)
- Development of tools, methods and models (global and sectoral)
   to measure and assess security of supply
- Policy recommendations on how to improve energy security taking into account costs, benefits and risks of various policy choices
- Consortium of 15 partners
- Duration: 3 years (36 months: January 2008 December 2010)
- Intensive Stakeholders consultations




